



CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT:

Concurrent enrollment allows high school students to take college classes while they are still enrolled in high school. These classes count for both high school and college credit. Students must be a junior or senior and will be responsible for textbooks and supplies. The grades earned in concurrent enrollment courses will be a part of the permanent student record at HCS and will be weighted as Honors and worth 10 units. Even though concurrent enrollment courses will be listed on the HCS transcript, students will still be required to submit an official college transcript for their college coursework when applying to college. Tuition is free for students in grades 9 - 12 for concurrent enrollment.

- Transferrable college credits
- Both high school and college credit for a single course, potentially reducing the time needed to earn a college degree;
- Exposure to college courses while in high school, and thus a better understanding of what is expected in college;
- Improved skills in time management and handling responsibility as well as improved study habits;
- Increased confidence in their ability to handle college;
- Gain an understanding of the college culture.
